

## NAG 6—General Legislation

### Administration Policy

#### Rationale

The Board, as a crown entity, is required to comply with relevant legislation and contractual obligations. These obligations are sourced in statute, legislation and Ministry of Education regulations.

#### Purpose

To define the Board's statutory and legislative obligations and to specify how the Board will monitor its compliance in this regard.
